## Summary Report

- A call went out to MVFN members to be observers.
- An orientation meeting was not needed as all observers and boat operators had previous experience.
- Four teams conducted surveys on their assigned sections of the lake. The surveys were conducted at the end of the months of June, July and August.
- The large young survival rate was one more than last year and is in keeping with the recorded average since 2007 on Mississippi Lakes.
- The low adult Loon count in August was disappointing for the observers but is in keeping with the history from other years.
- The combined monthly Loon counts were 42 adults and 6 chicks in June.
  - 43 adults and 12 chicks in July.
  - 26 adults and 8 large young in August.
